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COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is an introduction to the counseling profession which operates in a variety of settings. Counseling theories and related techniques will be explored. A comparison and contrast of differing approaches will be done. Attention will be paid to basic issues such as change, human relationships, communication, and values and ethics in the change process.
